

## Michigan

Small businesses totaled 805,902 in Michigan in 2009. They represent 98.3 percent of all employers and employ 52.3 percent of the private-sector workforce. Being such a large part of the state's economy, these businesses are central to Michigan's health and well-being.

This profile uses the latest available data to illustrate the status of Michigan's small businesses. (Note that a small business is defined as one with fewer than 500 employees.)

- Michigan's economy was mixed in 2010, with real gross state product decreasing 3.7 percent and private-sector employment remaining flat (Bureau of Economic Analysis, Bureau of Labor Statistics).
- Most of Michigan's small businesses are very small as 78.2 percent of all businesses did not have employees and most employers have fewer than 20 employees.
- Small businesses employed 1.8 million workers in 2009 (Table 1) with most of the employment coming from firms with 20-499 employees.
- The employment situation in 2008-2009 was weak (Table 2); small businesses in Michigan had a net job loss from 2005-2008.
- Self-employment in Michigan declined over the last decade. Minority self-employment fared the best compared with other demographic groups during the decade.\*
- Throughout 2010, the number of opening establishments was lower than closing establishments and the net employment change from this turnover was negative (Table 3).

\* Because of the relatively low number of veterans in the survey data source, the veteran self-employment figure is susceptible to large fluctuations.
