



Advocacy: the voice of small business in government

U.S. Territories

As their economies tend to be small (making it difficult to support large businesses), small businesses dominate the U.S. territories. This profile from the Office of Advocacy compiles the latest facts and figures on the status and role of small business. (Because of limited firm size information, the number of business establishments is used as a proxy to represent the number of small businesses. In the United States in 2009, firms with fewer than 500 employees owned 84.1 percent of all privatesector establishments.)

• Puerto Rico has the largest economy of the U.S. territories. Puerto Rico had more private sector establishments and employment than 14 states and the District of Columbia in 2009. But wages are relatively low in Puerto Rico; its annual private sector payroll was only larger than six states, each of which has less than half the number of employees.

• While the economies of the territories have fared relatively well during the downturn, the largest territory, Puerto Rico has undergone declines in employment and number of establishments.

• Puerto Rico's unemployment rate hovered in the 10-12 percent range in the early 2000's but has been in the 15-16 percent range since early 2009.
