

## **Small Business Profile**

Advocacy: the voice of small business in government

## Massachusetts

Small businesses significantly impact Massachusetts's economy. They represent 97.8 percent of all employers and employ 46.3 percent of the private-sector labor force. Small businesses are crucial to the fiscal condition of the state and numbered 606,966 in 2010.

This profile uses the latest available data to illustrate the status of Massachusetts's small businesses. (Note that a small business is defined as one with fewer than 500 employees.)

- Massachusetts's economy was strong in 2011, with real gross state product increasing 3.7 percent and private-sector employment increasing 0.9 percent (Bureau of Economic Analysis, Bureau of Labor Statistics).
- Small businesses employed 1.4 million workers in 2010 (Table 1) with most of the employment coming from firms with 20-499 employees.
- The employment situation from 2007-2010 was weak, and small businesses in Massachusetts had a net job loss (Table 2). The unemployment rate in 2010-2011decreased by 0.9 percent.
- Most of Massachusetts's small businesses are very small as 77.5 percent of all businesses have no employees, and most employers have fewer than 20 employees.
- In 2011, the number of opening establishments was higher than closing establishments, and the net employment change from this turnover was positive (Table 3).
- Self-employment in Massachusetts improved over the last decade. Male self-employment fared the best compared with other demographic groups.
