

Economic Output and Employment

Figure 1: Employment by Establishment Size (Employees)



- The American Samoa economy grew at an annual rate of 2.2% to \$608.0 million while per capita income increased 3.4% to \$10,483 in 2018. (Source: BEA)
- The number of private sector employees in American Samoa decreased 3.6% to 8,203 in 2017. (Source: CBP)
- Figure 1 displays private sector employment for establishments with fewer than 500 employees from 2008 to 2017. Establishments with 1 to 19 employees have the largest share of small establishment employment. (Source: CBP)
- Table 1 provides additional details on American Samoa employment by industry. (Source: CBP)

Job and establishments statistics are from the 2017 County Business Patterns (CBP) and export statistics are from 2018 Bureau of Economic Analysis (BEA) data. Economic growth and trade statistics are expressed in real US dollars.

International Trade

- Figure 2 displays the evolution of American Samoa imports, exports, and trade balance from 2002 to 2018.

- In 2018, American Samoa total exports increased 14.3% to \$407.0 million, while its total imports decreased 1.8% to \$479.0 million. This resulted in a 2018 trade deficit of \$72.0 million. (Source: BEA)
- * Exports and imports reflect trade between American Samoa and the rest of the world, including the US.

Figure 2: Exports and Imports (\$)






Figure 3: American Samoa Employment by Municipality, 2017. (Source: CBP)
