

Establishments


Between March 2019 and March 2020, 10,475 Alabama establishments opened and 10,539 closed, for a net decrease of 64. Employment expanded at 26,549 and contracted at 27,563. Small businesses accounted for 10,192 openings and 10,214 closings.

Employment


Opening and expanding Alabama establishments added 168,423 jobs, while closing and contracting establishments lost 167,234, for a net increase of 1,189 jobs. Small businesses gained 141,402 jobs and lost 138,820, for a net increase of 2,582 jobs.



Small business loans

The Community Reinvestment Act requires large banks to report new small business loans. In 2019, reporting banks issued \$1.5 billion in loans to Alabama businesses with revenues of \$1 million or less. Total reported new lending to businesses through loans of \$100,000 or less was \$1.1 billion, and total reported new lending to businesses through loans of \$1 million or less was \$4.0 billion. 

A total of 4,205 identified firms exported goods worth \$20.0 billion from Alabama in 2019. Of those exporters, 3,354—or 79.8 percent—were small. Ownership shares include equal and majority ownership


