


Establishments

Between March 2019 and March 2020, 8,237 Idaho establishments opened and 5,818 closed, for a net increase of 2,419. Employment expanded at 14,264 and contracted at 11,447. Small businesses accounted for 8,225 openings and 5,789 closings.


Employment

Opening and expanding Idaho establishments added 75,627 jobs, while closing and contracting establishments lost 54,048, for a net increase of 21,579 jobs. Small businesses contributed a net increase of 19,608 jobs, or 90.9 percent of that total.

Thousands of jobs



Small business loans

The Community Reinvestment Act requires large banks to report new small business loans. In 2019, reporting banks issued \$608.4 million in loans to Idaho businesses with revenues of \$1 million or less. Total reported new lending to businesses through loans of \$100,000 or less was \$555.9 million, and total reported new lending to businesses through loans of \$1 million or less was \$1.6 billion.



Small business exports

A total of 1,694 identified firms exported goods worth \$3.1 billion from Idaho in 2019. Of those exporters, 1,434—or 84.7 percent—were small. Small firms exported goods worth \$919.0 million, making up 29.3 percent of exports by identified firms.


