

Share of employees working at small businesses by county




Between March 2019 and March 2020, 7,780 Kansas establishments opened and 7,954 closed, for a net decrease of 174. Employment expanded at 17,897 and contracted at 18,068. Small businesses accounted for 7,705 openings and 7,911 closings.



Employment

Opening and expanding Kansas establishments added 112,057 jobs, while closing and contracting establishments lost 110,392, for a net increase of 1,665 jobs. Small businesses gained 96,609 jobs and lost 94,149, for a net increase of 2,460 jobs.



Small business loans

The Community Reinvestment Act requires large banks to report new small business loans. In 2019, reporting banks issued \$691.3 million in loans to Kansas businesses with revenues of \$1 million or less. Total reported new lending to businesses through loans of \$100,000 or less was \$578.2 million, and total reported new lending to businesses through loans of \$1 million or less was \$2.0 billion.



Small business exports

A total of 3,354 identified firms exported goods worth \$10.4 billion from Kansas in 2019. Of those exporters, 2,753—or 82.1 percent—were small. Small firms exported goods worth \$2.3 billion, making up 21.8 percent of exports by identified firms.


