

# **Business dynamics**


#### **Establishments**

Between March 2019 and March 2020, 27,657 North Carolina establishments opened and 24,921 closed, for a net increase of 2,736. Employment expanded at 59,208 and contracted at 57,412. Small businesses accounted for 26,727 openings and 23,994 closings.


#### **Employment**

Opening and expanding North Carolina establishments added 400,590 jobs, while closing and contracting establishments lost 361,208, for a net increase of 39,382 jobs. Small businesses contributed a net increase of 38,572 jobs, or 97.9 percent of that total.

#### Thousands of jobs



#### **Small business loans**

The Community Reinvestment Act requires large banks to report new small business loans. In 2019, reporting banks issued \$2.9 billion in loans to North Carolina businesses with revenues of \$1 million or less. Total reported new lending to businesses through loans of \$100,000 or less was \$2.8 billion, and total reported new lending to businesses through loans of \$1 million or less was \$7.6 billion. 

## **Small business exports**

A total of 11,015 identified firms exported goods worth \$30.6 billion from North Carolina in 2019. Of those exporters, 9,567—or 86.9 percent—were small. Small firms exported goods worth \$6.1 billion, making up 19.9 percent of exports by identified firms.


