

Establishments


Between March 2019 and March 2020, 55,034 New York establishments opened and 68,692 closed, for a net decrease of 13,658. Employment expanded at 110,818 and contracted at 122,920. Small businesses accounted for 52,614 openings and 66,372 closings.

Employment


Opening and expanding New York establishments added 769,098 jobs, while closing and contracting establishments lost 817,309, for a net decrease of 48,211 jobs. Small businesses gained 585,281 jobs and lost 655,710, for a net decrease of 70,429 jobs.



Small business loans

The Community Reinvestment Act requires large banks to report new small business loans. In 2019, reporting banks issued \$4.8 billion in loans to New York businesses with revenues of \$1 million or less. Total reported new lending to businesses through loans of \$100,000 or less was \$7.2 billion, and total reported new lending to businesses through loans of \$1 million or less was \$16.1 billion. 

Ownership shares include equal and majority ownership


