



#### **Establishments**


Between March 2020 and March 2021, 38,622 North Carolina establishments opened and 24,041 closed, for a net increase of 14,581. Employment expanded at 55,330 establishments and contracted at 65,822. Small businesses accounted for 36,900 openings and 21,964 closings.

#### **Employment**

Opening and expanding North Carolina establishments added 440,563 jobs, while closing and contracting establishments lost 474,541, for a net decrease of 33,978 jobs. Small businesses gained 294,164 jobs and lost 305,926, for a net decrease of 11,762 jobs.







#### **Small business loans**

The Community Reinvestment Act requires large banks to report new small business loans. In 2020, reporting banks issued \$3.9 billion in loans to North Carolina businesses with revenues of \$1 million or less. 

#### **Small business exports**

A total of 10,514 identified firms exported goods worth \$26.1 billion from North Carolina in 2020. Of those exporters, 9,141—or 86.9 percent—were small. Exports by small firms reached \$5.6 billion, making up 21.4 percent of exports by identified firms.


