


Establishments

Between March 2021 and March 2022, 4,221 Vermont establishments opened and 2,236 closed, for a net increase of 1,985. Employment expanded at 5,706 establishments and contracted at 4,289. Small businesses accounted for 4,037 establishment openings and 2,133 closings.


Employment

Opening and expanding Vermont establishments added 32,204 jobs, while closing and contracting establishments lost 20,960, for a net increase of 11,244 jobs. Small businesses contributed a net increase of 11,232 jobs, or 99.9 percent of that total.

Thousands of establishments




Thousands of jobs

Small business loans

The Community Reinvestment Act requires large banks to report new small business loans. In 2021, reporting banks issued \$188.0 million in loans to Vermont businesses with revenues of \$1 million or less. 


Small business exports

A total of 1,025 identified firms exported goods worth \$2.4 billion from Vermont in 2021. Of those exporters, 889—or 86.7 percent—were small. Exports by small firms reached \$648.0 million, making up 26.5 percent of exports by identified firms.


