


#### **Establishments**

Between March 2022 and March 2023, 29,936 Colorado establishments opened and 26,843 closed, for a net increase of 3,093. Employment expanded at 47,333 establishments and contracted at 40,633. Small businesses accounted for 28,467 openings and 25,483 closings.


#### **Employment**

Opening and expanding Colorado establishments added 324,739 jobs, while closing and contracting establishments lost 269,701, for a net increase of 55,038 jobs. Small businesses contributed a net increase of 39,520 jobs, or 71.8 percent of that total.

#### **Small business loans**

The Community Reinvestment Act requires large banks to report new small business loans. In 2022, reporting banks issued \$1.9 billion in loans to Colorado businesses with revenues of \$1 million or less. Total reported new lending to businesses through loans of \$100,000 or less was \$2.1 billion. Total reported new lending to businesses through loans of \$1 million or less was \$5.3 billion.



#### **Small business exports**

A total of 5,722 identified firms exported goods worth \$9.8 billion from Colorado in 2022. Of those exporters, 4,986—or 87.1 percent—were small. Exports by small firms reached \$3.0 billion, making up 30.5 percent of exports by identified firms.


