




#### **Establishments**

Between March 2022 and March 2023, 4,661 Delaware establishments opened and 3,766 closed, for a net increase of 895. Employment expanded at 6,543 establishments and contracted at 5,552. Small businesses accounted for 4,424 establishment openings and 3,643 closings.

#### **Employment**

Opening and expanding Delaware establishments added 51,009 jobs, while closing and contracting establishments lost 37,325, for a net increase of 13,684 jobs. Small businesses contributed a net increase of 6,942 jobs, or 50.7 percent of that total.







#### **Small business loans**

The Community Reinvestment Act requires large banks to report new small business loans. In 2022, reporting banks issued \$267.1 million in loans to Delaware businesses with revenues of \$1 million or less. Total reported new lending to businesses through loans of \$100,000 or less was \$344.1 million. Total reported new lending to businesses through loans of \$1 million or less was \$760.1 million. 

#### **Small business exports**

A total of 2,233 identified firms exported goods worth \$4.4 billion from Delaware in 2022. Of those exporters, 1,969—or 88.2 percent—were small. 
