




Establishments

Between March 2022 and March 2023, 39,727 North Carolina establishments opened and 31,822 closed, for a net increase of 7,905. Employment expanded at 73,986 establishments and contracted at 55,530. Small businesses accounted for 37,771 openings and 29,998 closings.

Employment

Opening and expanding North Carolina establishments added 527,761 jobs, while closing and contracting establishments lost 392,311, for a net increase of 135,450 jobs. Small businesses contributed a net increase of 100,187 jobs, or 74.0 percent of that total.







Small business loans

The Community Reinvestment Act requires large banks to report new small business loans. In 2022, reporting banks issued \$3.4 billion in loans to North Carolina businesses with revenues of \$1 million or less. 

Small business exports

A total of 11,115 identified firms exported goods worth \$37.5 billion from North Carolina in 2022. Of those exporters, 9,646—or 86.8 percent—were small. Exports by small firms reached \$8.2 billion, making up 21.9 percent of exports by identified firms.


