


#### Employer and employment dynamics

#### **Establishments**

Between March 2022 and March 2023, 15,085 Oklahoma establishments opened and 10,030 closed, for a net increase of 5,055. Employment expanded at 25,049 establishments and contracted at 21,222. Small businesses accounted for 14,080 openings and 9,427 closings.

#### Employment

Opening and expanding Oklahoma establishments added 180,940 jobs, while closing and contracting establishments lost 126,785, for a net increase of 54,155 jobs. Small businesses contributed a net increase of 41,514 jobs, or 76.7 percent of that total. Thousands of establishments



#### Small business loans

The Community Reinvestment Act requires large banks to report new small business loans. In 2022, reporting banks issued \$1.2 billion in loans to Oklahoma businesses with revenues of \$1 million or less. 

#### Small business exports

A total of 3,017 identified firms exported goods worth \$6.3 billion from Oklahoma in 2022. Of those exporters, 2,532—or 83.9 percent—were small. 
