


Establishments

Between March 2022 and March 2023, 22,987 South Carolina establishments opened and 15,269 closed, for a net increase of 7,718. Employment expanded at 35,024 establishments and contracted at 27,157. Small businesses accounted for 21,702 openings and 14,470 closings.


Employment

Opening and expanding South Carolina establishments added 259,139 jobs, while closing and contracting establishments lost 190,128, for a net increase of 69,011 jobs. Small businesses contributed a net increase of 54,695 jobs, or 79.3 percent of that total.

Thousands of jobs



Small business loans

The Community Reinvestment Act requires large banks to report new small business loans. In 2022, reporting banks issued \$1.6 billion in loans to South Carolina businesses with revenues of \$1 million or less. 

Small business exports

A total of 6,537 identified firms exported goods worth \$28.7 billion from South Carolina in 2022. Of those exporters, 5,485—or 83.9 percent—were small. Exports by small firms reached \$3.8 billion, making up 13.2 percent of exports by identified firms.


