




#### **Establishments**

Between March 2022 and March 2023, 27,723 Washington establishments opened and 32,646 closed, for a net decrease of 4,923. Employment expanded at 55,650 establishments and contracted at 48,511. Small businesses accounted for 25,458 openings and 16,498 closings.


#### Employment

Opening and expanding Washington establishments added 383,413 jobs, while closing and contracting establishments lost 306,674, for a net increase of 76,739 jobs. Small businesses contributed a net increase of 61,763 jobs, or 80.5 percent of that total.





#### Thousands of jobs



# Small business loans

The Community Reinvestment Act requires large banks to report new small business loans. In 2022, reporting banks issued \$1.8 billion in loans to Washington businesses with revenues of \$1 million or less. 

# Small business exports

A total of 11,272 identified firms exported goods worth \$55.8 billion from Washington in 2022. Of those exporters, 9,971—or 88.5 percent—were small. 
